Michael Rapacz

ST. JOHNSVILLE — Michael Rapacz, 89, of St. Johnsville, died Sunday at Little Falls Hospital.

Mr. Rapacz was born Nov. 11, 1891 in the Ukrainian province of Galicia. He came to this country in 1909 and was married to the late Julia Yankoin in 1913.

Until his death, Mr. Rapacz was the only surviving charter member of the St. Johnsville Rotary Club, of which he was past president. He was also the oldest St. Johnsville merchant, having been in the grocery business from 1913 until six months ago. He was a member and one of the founders of the Church of the Immaculate Conception. He was a member and past president of the St. Johnsville Retail Merchants Association and past member of the St. Johnsville Board of Education. Mr. Rapacz also was a member of the United Ukrainian-American Relief Committee, Inc., and the Ukrainian Workingmen's Association.

Mr. Rapacz is survived by four sons, John and Michael both of St. Johnsville; Raymond of New Hartford, and Richard of Marshfield, Mass.; one daughter, Anna Politylo of Herkimer; one sister, in the Ukraine; 15 grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by a son, Michael, and two daughters, Rose Rapacz and Helen McNamee.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 9 a.m. from the C.C. Lull Funeral Home and at 9:30 a.m. from the Church of the Immaculate Conception, where the Rev. Ivan Dawydowych will offer a Requiem Mass. Prayer services will be conducted by the Rev. Dawydowych at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday. Calling hours will be tonight from 7 to 9 and Tuesday from 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 p.m. Donations may be made in memory of Mr. Rapacz to the Church of the Immaculate Conception or to SAVAC.
