Worked as a machinist for General Electric in Utica

LITTLE FALLS — Mr. Alec Polansky, 76, of Polansky Road, passed away Wednesday, Oct. 18, 2000, in Samaritan Hospital, Troy.

He was born in Pennsylvania on Oct. 13, 1924, the son of the late Steven and Theresa Pytel Polansky and attended Dolgeville schools.

Alec enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps on March 25, 1943, in Syracuse. He served during World War II with the Fourth Marine Division as a corporal in the Pacific Theater as an infantryman and in 1945 was assigned to the Marine Air Corps as an aircraft mechanic and was honorably discharged March 1, 1946.

He was married to Julia Politylo on Nov. 19, 1949, in St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church, Herkimer. Mr. Polansky was employed as a

machinist for General Electric, French Road, Utica plant for many years until his retirement in 1986. He

was a communicant of St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church and a member of the International Union of Electrical Workers.

Mr. Polansky is survived by his beloved wife, Julia; two daughters and sons-in-law, Mary and Robert Pezdek of Cohoes and Jean and Mark Connolly of Mechanicville; three sisters, Mary Kazmierski of Herkimer, Helen Korniat of Ilion and Rose Parks of Dolgeville; two granddaughters, Sarah and Laura; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was predeceased by two brothers, William Polansky and Peter Polansky.

His funeral will be held Saturday morning at 9 from Petykiewicz Iocovozzi & Burns Funeral Home, 329 S. Washington St., Herkimer, and 9:30 in St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church with the Rev. Fr. Nicholas Newmerzycky, pastor. Interment will be in the parish cemetery.
